Gral-a Bike

Capital Bikeshare is the region's bike sharing system (first in the U.S., too). With more than 430 stations, 3,500 bikes and the **Spotcycle app**, you can travel like a local for work or play! Grab a red bike at your nearest station. **capitalbikeshare.com**



Ride the Rail

Metrorail provides a convenient transportation option to nearly all major DC places to see and be seen. Rides start at \$1.75 and require a SmarTrip® card, available for purchase at any Metrorail station and select CVS/pharmacy and Giant Food stores. **wmata.com**



Catch a Bus

Metrobus and the **DC Circulator** are low-cost travel solutions. The DC Circulator operates six unique routes to the city's most popular sights—the National Mall, Nationals Park, Georgetown and Union Station. Hop a Streetcar
